Description: I estimate the boost and catch up effect of a quota policy on affirmative action candidates to a law school in Rio de Janeiro. Additionally, I investigate the existence of any negative effect on non affirmative action candidates who would be admitted had the policy not been active. The empirical results reveal a great increase in chances of passing the OAB exam (equivalent to the American BAR exam) for quota admitted candidates, and no discontinuity between non-quota candidates close to the admittance cutoff score.
